

F23/24 Financial Performance

F23/24 was a spectacularly successful year for the Chinook Regional Hospital Foundation. Thanks to renewed efforts in fundraising, campaigns, and other outreach, we managed to more than double our previous annual revenue. Following deductions and expenses, that leaves us with a net income that has risen by an incredible 562.82% compared to the previous year.

Because of this dramatic rise, we were able to fulfill all our commitments to AHS disbursements while retaining a considerable surplus to carry forward. We now have an exciting opportunity to channel this extra community funding into both ongoing operational security for our Foundation and – more importantly – investments in future Foundation healthcare support efforts.







Short Term: Grow Our Foundation Team

Our Foundation was founded in 1988. In many ways, almost 40 years later, we are still building on the goals and vision set out back then. Bringing Hearts Home



Cardiac Sciences Centre of Excellence

Cardiac disease is the #1 cause of death in southern Alberta. Working with proven partners and local and provincial governments, it is our Foundation's multiyear vision to create a Cardiac Sciences Centre of Excellence to serve the AHS South Zone. We are currently in the preliminary phases of making this vision a reality, with initial feasibility studies to be completed in June, 2024.

We foresee the need for fundraising to achieve these goals. Using donations, we intend to upgrade or renovate existing cardiac care facilities, equipment, and services at both regional hospitals for all southern Albertan patients, and secure the purchase of technology to drive our region's healthcare forward. This will improve access to care, prioritizing excellence in heart health by focusing on prevention, detection, and treatment to benefit people of all ages and demographics. It's an ambitious goal – but with the backing of our outstanding community, we're certain it's within our reach!

The Foundation has also aided many clinical team wellness supports including Schwartz Rounds. led International Women's Day celebrations, and helped our teams launch a new computerized charting system. Finally, the Foundation has boldly embraced a transformative vision to support enhanced cardiac care in Southern Alberta."

LINAC for Jack Ady Cancer Centre

The Jack Ady Cancer Centre is situated in the Chinook Regional Hospital, and is one of the leading sites for ongoing cancer care in southern Alberta. The Centre currently needs a new LINAC machine – otherwise known as a linear accelerator. The LINAC is a vital tool in cancer treatment, using literal laser-focus to deliver pinpoint beams of radiation that kill cancer cells without damaging nearby healthy tissue.

The full price of a new LINAC machine and all associated costs is \$3.6M. We are working with our partners and friends to organize institutional funding for the majority of this total, but as always we're counting on donations to help us across the finish line. Keep your eyes peeled: we'll announce our specific campaign goals on social media when details are finalized.
